

REQUIRED SCHOOL SUPPLIES

GRADE FIVE

2011-2012

All supplies should be labeled with student name
Students must have supplies for the first day of classes

- 1 Sturdy zippered pouch for pencils/crayons (CDS model has proven durable)
- 3 **(1-subject or 3-subject)** notebooks; NOT 5 subject please
- 2 composition notes
- 1 Spiral, 1/4 inch "graph" notebook for math (School Store)
- 1 zippered binder
- 6 Three hole pocket folders (preferably different, solid colors if possible)
- 1 Country Day Assignment Notebook
- 1 Container of Elmer's Glue or Glue Stick
- 1 Red marking pen
- 2 Yellow highlighters
- 1 Pair of "serious" scissors
- 1 Set (8) of colored pencils – not crayons
- 1 Ballpoint pen with eraser (Black or Blue only)
- 1 Rand McNally World Atlas (most recent edition available only in School Store)
- A **good** supply of #2 pencils (No mechanical pencils, please)
- 2 Pink, pearl erasers
- "Book Sox" or other sturdy cover for Math textbooks
- Required PE Uniform and Water Jug
- 1 box of Kleenex
- Supply of 3 X 3 post its
- 1 pack of loose leaf paper

ART: One soft 'drawing" pencil - #3B to #6B; one kneaded gray eraser, one pink pearl eraser,, one fine waterproof drafting pen (Sakura pigment #5 is best; Pilot rolling ball is fine), as well as basic home, art supplies. Pencils, erasers and pens should be unmarked as they are pooled for class supplies. A small Sketchbook/journal (available at School store) *is optional*.

COMPUTER: USB flash drive
child accessible internet based e-mail account

BAND: Band instrument and "**Essential Elements, Book I, 2000**"

Optional:

- 1. Vox Spanish & English Dictionary. (Available in School Store)

Notes:

- 1. At the 5 grade level, a great deal of dictionary work is done. An **Intermediate level** home dictionary is essential. (Avoid "pocket" editions)
- 2. Students are urged to mark their name on all property with a permanent marker.
- 3. Supplies do run out and will need to be replaced. Students will need to have all items listed available throughout the year.

Extra or unnecessary "stuff" interferes with the student's ability to organize efficiently. Rule of thumb: if it's not on the Supply List, your child doesn't need it!
